Professional Orientation to Counseling: Development of Skills and Attitudes

Course Description: This course is a graduate level introduction to the foundational skills necessary for mental health practitioner students. This course will cover a wide variety of topics including; development of professional identity, critical thinking skills, information gathering skills, competencies in the classroom, e-learning tools, academic and professional writing styles, and exploration of theoretical orientation.

Required Text: No required text for this course

Course Objectives:

- 1. Students will begin to conceptualize and clarify their professional goals as a mental health counselor.
- 2. Students will be introduced and challenged to gain proficiency in the use of tools of a professional graduate student in the Doane MAC program.
- 3. Students will be introduced to and apply skills for using Doane Learning Commons.
- 4. Students will be challenged to understand and master a full range of writing skills, allowing for growth as a professional.
- 5. Students will be challenged to understand their central role and responsibility in the transformational learning process.

Course Format:

This course will be structured in a modular format; each module will begin and end with group meetings to allow students to begin to view themselves as contributing members of a learning and intellectual community. Participation and sharing within the learning community will be a strong component of this course. Guest speakers, lecture, group discussions, small group activities, and outside assignments will provide students opportunities to expand their knowledge in the field of counseling.

Course Requirements/Assignments:

Attendance is required and will be taken for each session. Loss of points (up to one letter grade is possible) will occur for more then 1 absence.

Readings/Blackboard Activities are required before the beginning of the course night discussion as well as Blackboard activities related to the readings and topics.

Writing Module will be completed and student will select one example of their work to be reviewed by 3 peers.

Professional Identify Statements will be developed by the end of the term.

Theoretical Orientation Development will begin in this course.

Assignments will be expected on time, if late 50% of grade will be deducted.

To receive a grade of B or better all assignments must be completed. Grades will be calculated based upon the percent of points earned out of the total possible points.
